RDAS provides individual Disability Advocacy service assisting for people with a disability. We can assist you throughout the NDIS application and implementation process.

RDAS can help you if you decide to apply for a plan. RDAS is independent of the NDIA and the AAT.

RDAS staff can:

- Help you to understand what you need to do
- Advise you how to get any documents and help you get them ready for your planning meeting, and reviews (if required)
- Assist you to access legal representation if you submit an appeal
- Provide you with support to speak to the AAT by yourself.
- Go with you to AAT meetings and provide support.

RDAS is not able to provide legal advice but can connect you to Legal Aid, which can provide legal advice and represent you at the AAT hearing. **You do not have to pay for a review or a support person to help you.**

2021 – Year 7 Vaccinations

The first round of school vaccinations is being conducted at this school on <u>Monday 22nd February 2021.</u>

These vaccinations are funded on the National Immunisation Schedule. Should your child miss out on starting their vaccination course this year they may not be eligible to receive them for free in subsequent years.

Parent information packs were sent home recently.

ALL relevant sections of the consent card must be completed, signed and returned to the school even if your child is NOT being vaccinated.

To consent to your child being vaccinated with one or more vaccines, please tick and sign the relevant <u>YES</u> sections of the consent card in blue or black pen.

If you **DO NOT** wish to have your child vaccinated with one or more vaccines or if your child has already been vaccinated, please tick the relevant **NO** section on the consent card and return them to the school by **Wednesday 17 February 2021**. Please return the card to the school even if your child is not being vaccinated.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by emailing your withdrawal of consent to Council's Immunisation Team on **immunise@wodonga.vic.gov.au** before the vaccination day.

Please ensure that your child is wearing their sports uniform or a short sleeve shirt on the day of vaccinations (without too many layers underneath), this will enable a smooth vaccination process.
