Cross-border community changes

Residents of the cross-border community local government areas will now be required to obtain a permit to cross between Victoria and NSW from 6pm, Friday 13 August and must have an approved reason to travel.

If they have a permit, staff and students from the Cross Border Community Area can still cross the Victorian-NSW border for the purposes of work or education (which includes childcare or early childhood services as well as universities and TAFEs etc).

The full list of reasons Cross Border Community Area residents can cross the Victorian-NSW border includes:

- Necessary goods and services, lincluding medical care
- Care or other compassionate reasons
- Work (whether paid or voluntary, including for charitable or religious purposes)
- Education (including childcare or early childhood services as well as higher education and TAFE etc)
- Receiving a COVID-19 vaccination

Organised/community sport and exercise connected to or organised by a club or facility.

Residents will be able to apply for a permit from Thursday afternoon at the <u>Service Victoria website</u> and via the Service Victoria app.

Although it has been a mixed-up start to the term with students going between remote learning and face to face learning at school, it's good to see they have adjusted to these changes fairly well.

We have continued integrating our Term 3 Topic of 'Festivals/Celebrations' within our literacy sessions and have also enjoyed incorporating 'The 2020 Tokyo Olympics' within our learning, as our focus for the past 2 weeks has been Japan. Students have enjoyed watching snippets of the Olympics and keeping track of Australia's medal tally.

We have learnt lots of facts about Japan and its unique culture, as well as their significant festivals, including Shogatsu (New Year), Setsubun (The Bean-Throwing Festival) and Hanami (Cherry Blossom Festival).

Students have enjoyed writing poetry, in particular acrostic poems and 'Haiku' poetry which is traditional in Japan. They have completed a range of associated reading, writing and comprehension tasks and activities, as well as making Japanese pancakes and sushi and creating Japanese artwork.

In Maths we have started working on 'Location and transformation'. Students are familiarising themselves with the positional language used for the movement of items and specific language used to give directions.

We look forward to continuing our learning across all areas at school.

WE WANT OUR PARENTS/CAREGIVERS/GUARDIANS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents/caregivers/guardians (previously known as the Parent Opinion Survey). It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, student engagement and experiences of remote and flexible learning. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Approximately 30 per cent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year, the Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 19**th **July** to <u>Friday 3rd September</u>.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (Hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.


