HEALTH & HYGIENE

To support the well-being and health of everyone at school, everyone is reminded that it is important that your child is kept at home if he/she has:

- a temperature (more than 37.5°C)
- a cough
- a runny nose
- a sore throat
- muscle aches

FACE MASKS

As announced last week, the Government has issued new guidelines to combat the spread of COVID-19 in schools, which now includes the wearing of masks for Years 3-6 students when indoors and is encouraged for Foundation to Year 2 students. Please note there are exceptions for not wearing a mask.

Exceptions for all year levels include:

 students who have a physical or mental health illness or condition, or disability, which makes wearing a face covering unsuitable, including persons with obstructed breathing, a serious skin condition of the face, an intellectual disability, a mental health condition or persons who have experienced trauma.

Please do not hesitate to communicate with your child's teacher if they are excused from wearing a face mask. To assist students who can wear a mask, we ask that they come with a labelled clip-lock bag to place their mask in when they are not wearing it. We acknowledge this will be yet another challenge for our students, and staff will strive to support them build their tolerance of wearing a face mask. The key focus will be wearing them indoors where social distancing is a challenge.

Helping Families to Beat Financial Hardship

With many Australian families doing it extra tough because of the pandemic, a new financial counselling service launched by Variety - the Children's Charity is here to help.

The Variety Financial Counselling Service is aimed at families in need with children of kids who are sick. disadvantaged or living with disability.

Raising a child with a disability or illness can be expensive and creates pressures on families who face a unique set of financial circumstances - like high medical costs, specialised educational needs and home modifications – all on a reduced income due to their caring responsibilities.

In response to these complex issues, the free service can help families anywhere in Australia who are dealing with monetary stress and hardship.

"We know financial counselling is an identified need amongst families facing challenges, such as the cost of having a child or multiple children with chronic illness or disability, single parent households, inability to work due to being a carer, ineligibility for NDIS funding, loss of income or reliance on government assistance," explained Variety Queensland CEO, Steve Wakerley.

Variety's trained Financial Counsellors are equipped to offer help on everything from planning household budgets and managing debt, to negotiating with creditors, accessing utility grants, and providing Centrelink guidance.

families facing the high costs of raising a child with a disability,' said Jon O'Mally, the Executive Officer of Financial Counsellors Association of Queensland.

The free service, made possible by the support of the AMP Foundation, has been developed to assist with the future needs of a child with a disability or illness and their whole family. It is available around Australia via an internet/phone-based service

The new financial counselling program is the latest in a series of initiatives created by Variety to support Aussie kids who are sick, disadvantaged or living with a disability, when they need it most.

Other support services include equipment grants, scholarships and creating rewarding experiences through sports days, sports camps, and choirs, as well as providing educational experiences.

Financial Counsellors are qualified professionals who provide their services for free. They are independent, non-judgmental and confidential.

This is a privately organised group – no formal supports provided




