To all our families, thank you for all your hard work and support this term! Have a wonderful holiday and we look to seeing everyone back next term.

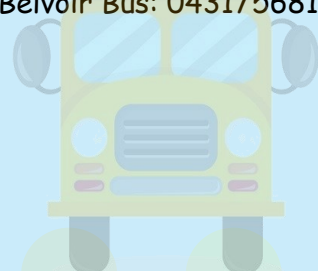

ROOM 22 NEWS

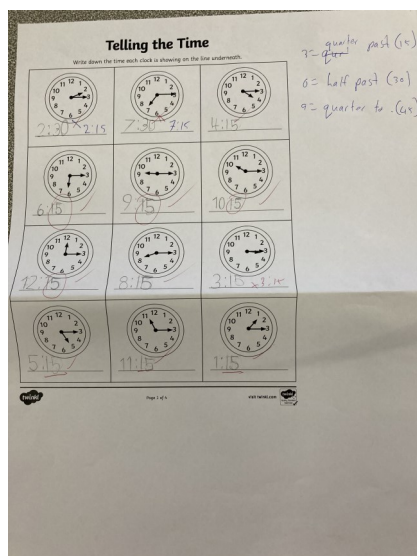

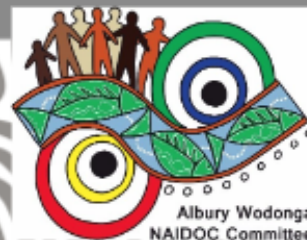
