In Literacy, they have worked hard on their phonics and spelling using the 'Sounds Write' program, as well as learning how to write and follow steps in a procedure. Some of their favourite procedures have included brushing their teeth, making pizza, planting seeds and making a pirate hat.

During Math sessions, we have been working on 'Measurement' and students have enjoyed measuring the length of items using informal and formal units; measuring the capacity of liquids in various sized containers and jugs; and measuring and comparing the weight of different items. We have also started on 'Statistics', where we have been looking at taking data and then tallying and graphing these results.

As part of our Health term topic, Room 8 have enjoyed playing various outdoor games together and have demonstrated fair play, turn taking and cooperation skills.





All testing must be completed at home before school with parents/carers reporting any **POSITIVE** Test results to:

- o Name of Student
- o Date of Test
- State Departments depending on whether you live in Victoria or NSW:
 - o Victorian Department of Health:
 - <u>Report a Positive Rapid Antigen Tests</u> Coronavirus Victoria website, or Coronavirus Hotline 1800 675 398 as soon as possible.
 - o Service NSW:
 - Register it on <u>service.nsw.gov.au</u> or the Service NSW app as soon as possible.

THE SCHOOL DOES NOT REQUIRE ANY NOTIFICATION OF NEGATIVE RAPID ANTIGEN TESTS.

For the latest information from a positive result after undertaking a Rapid Antigen Test:

- Victoria Rapid Antigen Tests
- NSW COVID-19 Testing & Self-Isolating

RECOVERED COVID CASES

Anyone who has recovered from COVID-19 is exempt from testing and quarantine requirements if they are reexposed to a case within 30 days of testing positive. This includes not completing rapid antigen tests as you may still test positive while shedding the virus but you are no longer contagious / infectious.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO ADDIV

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.


You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

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
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
