The show 'A LAND OF SNOW AND ICE' is coming to Belvoir!!






Hothouse Theatre and Belvoir Special School have successfully been selected to be a part of the <u>Creative Learning Partnership Program 2022</u> through Creative Victoria. Starting this term in Week 6, 8 and 9 all students at Belvoir will have the opportunity to work with visual artist Pinky Wittingslow to design and install an arctic landscape in the hall. They will do this using primarily recycled materials.

They will also explore sensory storytelling - exploring the sounds and the smells and sights of the arctic. In the final week of the residency, the students will become participants in an immersive adventure to the arctic - facilitated by local actors. They will become explorers and use the information that they have gained to engage with the mission of saving the seeds in the seed bank.
