What a big term it has already been! Over here at Felltimber, Wodonga Middle Years College in R3, it has been super busy. We are learning about Healthy Bodies and Healthy Minds, which has seen us visit the Wodonga Lawn Bowls, Sumsion Gardens, White Box Rise Park and Wonga Wetlands with C1 from Huon. We have enjoyed getting to know the C1 class, who are linked to us and our learning. We have been building friendships and learning how to relax safely, make positive choices and learn how to restore relationships and get back into a positive mindset so we can be healthy and happy. We have been busy making healthy food choices whilst learning basic cooking skills in our Food Tech classes. So far we've made pancakes, BLT sandwiches, Banana Muffins, and muffin pizza's. Our skills are getting better and better each time we are in the kitchen. We were lucky enough to be a part of the Dry Ice experiments that were happening in the Yr. 9 Science classes this term too. Lucy Widdup taught us about how dry ice changes behaviour depending on how it is being used. We made small and giant bubbles with detergent, added food colour, and saw it 'pop' it's lid when we put dry ice inside a bucket with warm water and placed the lid on (this was probably one of the most fun experiments). We enjoyed helping in the experiments and wearing the full safety equipment of lab coat and goggles. We felt like real scientists.

Some of us have been lucky enough to begin our electives. The Year 8's have been attending Art, when you can see CJ getting ready to do a lino print. We have also been having fun in Thursday Afternoon Activities where the Year 7 & 8 have been having a go at a variety of different activities like down ball, chess and basketball, so we know what they are like before we choose 1 to do next term, for the whole term. The Year 9 students have been already locked into an activity for the whole term. Some are doing mountain biking, others are doing e-sports or boardgames.

But the most exciting thing that we have done so far is to go on camp. Most of us went to Harrietville on the Mountain View camp. We had a go at mountain biking, archery, low ropes, hut building, bushwalking, swimming in Bright and exploring around Bright, the flying fox, and volleyball. We had so much fun! We learned a new game called Ga Ga Ball (like dodgeball but crazier and all played in a large octagon enclosed space). This game was a crowd pleaser — super fast and lots of laughter. We ate so much because the food was amazing and we all made some new friends. For those that didn't go to camp, they went to Huon where they had day activities to do. 




In numeracy, we have been exploring schedules and the things that we do every day. We have also been learning about time in relation to calendars and learning about days of the week and months of the year.




It's that time of the year again when we ask our families to help us raise funds for the school by supporting our Annual Easter Raffle!





Session 2: 25th March at Inflatable funhouse, Wodonga

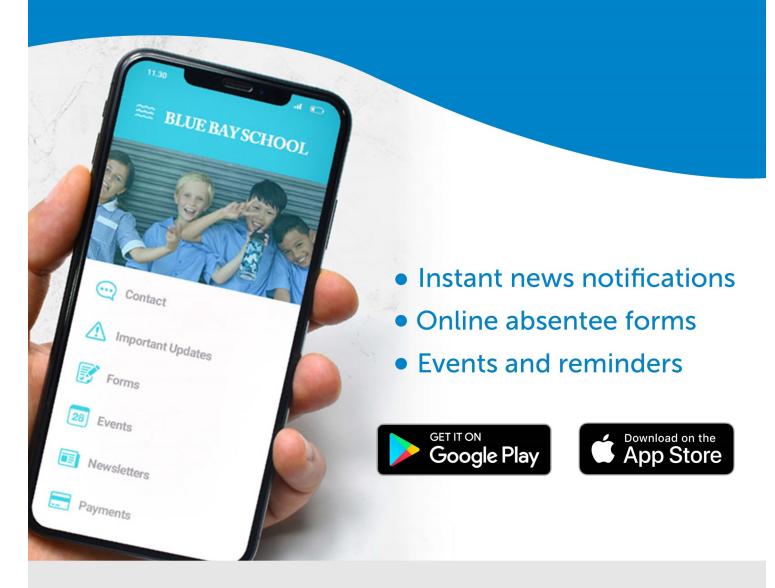



# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

# CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

#### **HOW TO APPLY**


New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments**; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.







#### **CSEF ELIGIBILITY**

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

#### Criteria 1 - General eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one
- · on the first day of Term two
- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent,
   and:
- b) submit an application to the school by the due date.

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

#### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

#### **Special Consideration**

A special consideration category exists for

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

#### **Eligibility Date**

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (30 January 2023) or term two (24 April 2023).

#### PAYMENT AMOUNTS

### **CSEF** payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents/carers so please register your interest at the school.

#### HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

#### NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

If you are seeking special consideration, mark this in the form and provide a copy of the relevant documentation.

- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2023 closes on the 23 June 2023.
