I urge all families to try to complete the survey if possible.


Book Week

Room 7 Superstars have shown great enthusiasm and stamina thus far in Term 3.


One of our focus areas has been on being BRAVE. We are identifying, celebrating and reinforcing Moments of Bravery within Room 7.


We've also had a focus on improving our writing skills. The boys have shown enormous progress and we are all very proud of their efforts.

Term 2 saw the beginning of the IPPs students running a weekly Staff Café. Students came up with a menu, researched costs involved in making food items and created advertising to let staff know what they were going to be doing.

Each Monday morning students visit every classroom and office across the school to collect orders for the current week, hand out order forms for the following week and answer questions from staff. Students then tally the orders and label bags ready for Tuesday packaging.

The 3 IPPs classes are divided into 2 groups with each group making one of the food items.

We have kept staff interest by making 2 different food items each week. Pictured here are Chocolate Zucchini Cake and School Made Beetroot Dip and Tzatziki Dip with carrot, celery and biscuits.

Students are expected to assist in the clean up each week with students washing and drying dishes, wiping down benches and putting items away after use.

Students are supported where needed to complete a task and encouraged to be as independent as possible to follow the kitchen procedures.

Students work together to read the packaging to see what menu item is ordered and to place the menu item into packaging.

Once items are packaged students sort into delivery locations and deliver the food across the school.

During Term 2 students took over 400 orders in 8 weeks. The beginning of this term has continued to prove popular with staff. Students are telling us that they are noticing their confidence growing in answering staff questions, following recipes, and preparing the packaging each week. The students are extremely proud of the high quality food they are providing staff each week (and tasting themselves).

We are assisting our students to improve on and gain skills that will be meaningful and useful in life after school. The money collected each week is being put back directly into

the program. We use it to buy ingredients, have bought various shapes and sizes of cake tins and trays, a food processor and an electric beater. Feedback from staff each week is positive with this often being a conversation starter between our IPPs students and staff that they would not normally interact with.




