VPC Studies

As part of their VPC studies, students from room 21 and 22 have been collaborating with Wodonga Landcare. Karen and Jo, who are passionate conservationists, have been guiding us in weekly sessions, teaching us about the significance of natural areas around Albury-Wodonga. This term, we have been fortunate enough to visit a site where squirrel gliders and sugar gliders live. We also walked across a small section of the rail trail that goes through a wetland. We learned about the importance of nest boxes for native fauna. These boxes act as tree hollows for animals to live in, and we were given the opportunity to use a pole

camera connected to a mobile phone to look inside. Students also learned about the different ecosystems and how they influence what animals may live in the area. Belvoir looks forward to continue collaboration with community organisations such as Wodonga Landcare, who have provided excellent learning opportunities for our students.



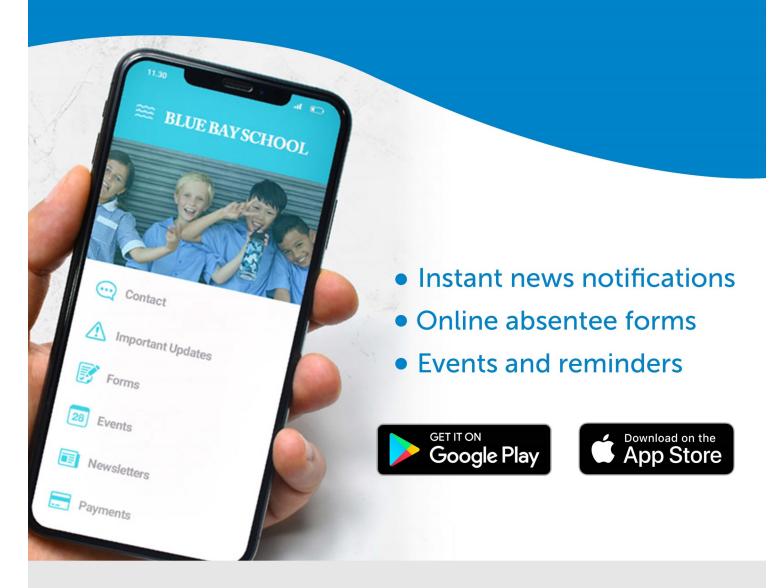
