COLD and FLU

With the arrival of colder weather, cases of influenza (the flu) and COVID are increasing throughout Victoria. Our community is at risk of higher rates of students and staff affected by the flu, COVID and other illnesses over the winter season.

To help keep your child and our school community safe, please take the following steps if your child has any cold or flu-like symptoms:

- keep your child at home until their symptoms pass
- common flu-like symptoms include a high fever, cough, runny nose, loss of appetite, body aches and feeling extremely weak and tired

 diagnosis of the flu can only be confirmed by a doctor after a nose or throat swab encourage your child to wash their hands regularly and ask them to cover their nose and mouth when sneezing and coughing.

Winter and colder days are on the way! This is your friendly reminder to check that you have cold weather uniforms (pants, trackies, jumpers) ready for those chilly days and they are labelled.

Attendance tips for parents

- Schools want to work in partnership with parents act early if you have any concerns by contacting your child's school and asking for advice and support
- Remember that every day counts
- There is no safe number of days for missing school each day a student can affect their social connectedness
- Talk positively about school and the importance of attending every day
- Open and prompt communication with your child's school about all absences is a good idea
- Avoid making routine medical and dental appointments during the school day or planning family holidays during the term
- Seek help from your school if you are concerned about your child's attendance and wellbeing. Schools want to work in partnership with parents to support student attendance and wellbeing.

The Department of Transport & Planning <u>Travel Pass program</u> provides free 30-day Travel Passes to Victorian students who are experiencing crisis to ensure they can continue to attend school by using public transport.

The program was recently expanded to include caregivers of eligible students, ensuring that they can accompany a student on their journey.

Students' eligibility is determined on a case-by-case basis by the school and the passes can be used across Victoria's public transport network.

Travel Passes

Primary, secondary and specialist schools can receive 30-day Travel Passes free of charge to give to students in crisis.

Travel Passes can be used on:


bus, train and tram trips in metropolitan Melbourne (Zone 1 and 2) all regional town buses PTV inter-town buses
