We will also be holding a School Assembly Friday afternoon at 2:10. All members of the Belvoir Community are encouraged to attend.

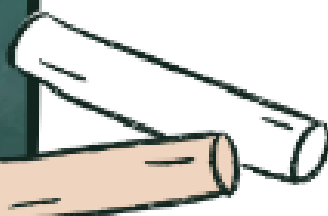

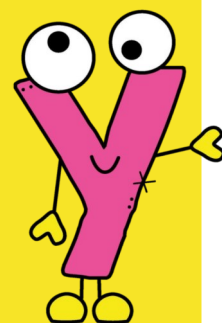




ROOM 1 NEWS

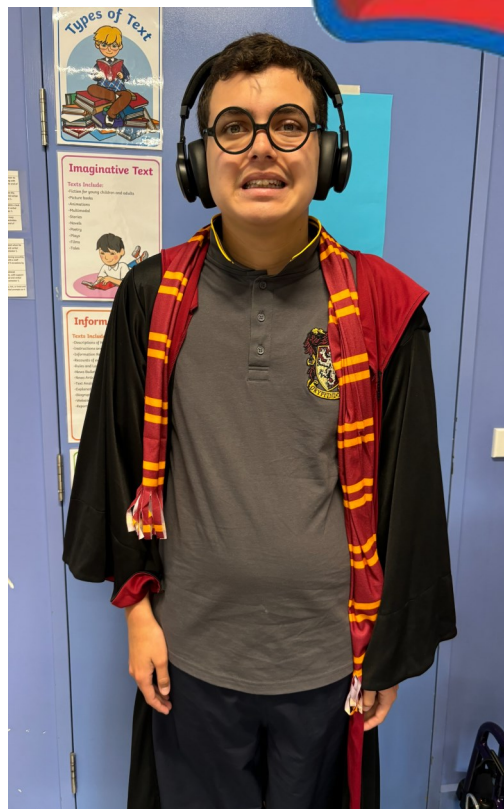

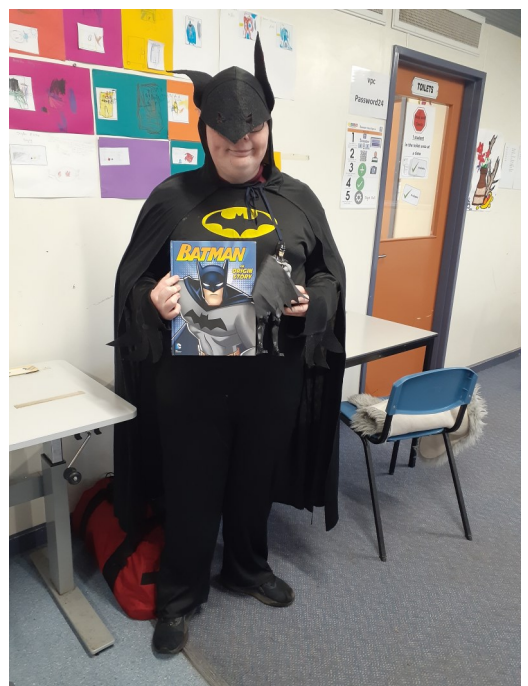

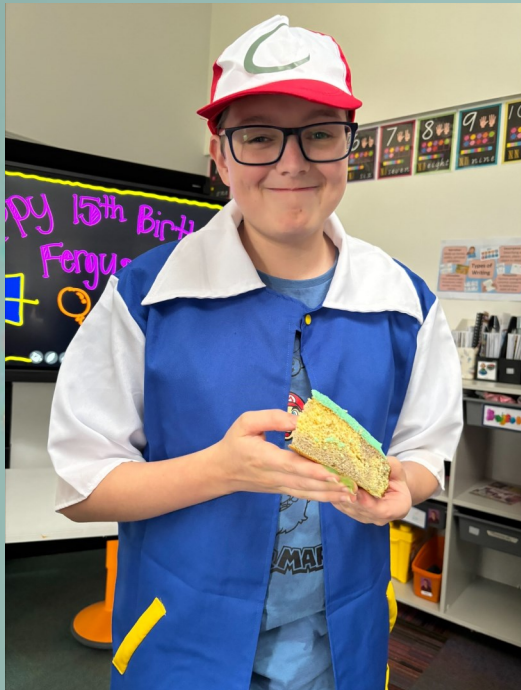
