It has certainly been a very busy term, and we certainly hope that all families remain safe and healthy over the break.





## ORANGE POD EXCURSION



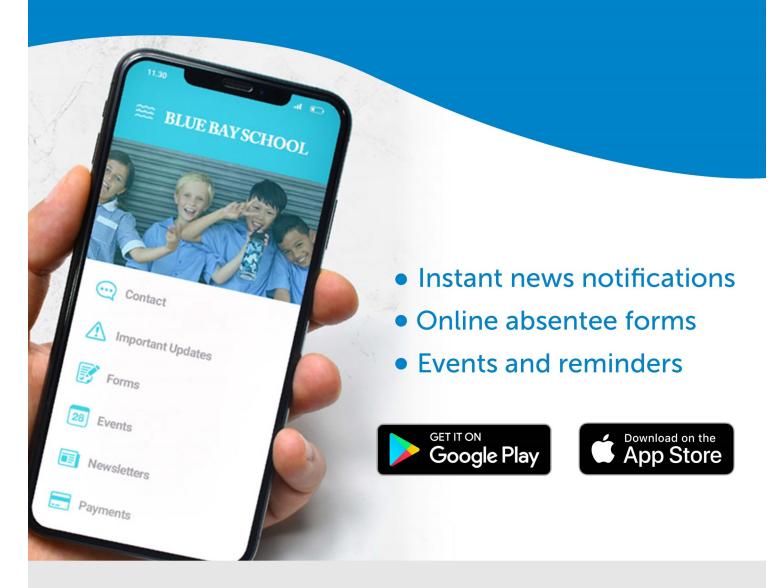
