Managing Unwell Students

I am writing with some important updates about ensuring the safety, health and wellbeing of the children, families and staff in our school community during the winter season. As you would be aware, influenza (flu) cases have been rising across Victoria and COVID-19 cases persist, so we want to protect our children and staff during this time.

If children are unwell, they are required to stay at home, unless those symptoms are known to be caused by an underlying health condition or medication. This will help our school keep other children, staff members and their families as safe as possible. Viruses spread quickly when there is close contact and cause many of the diseases that are common among children — especially when a child is coughing and sneezing.


